Junior Infant Vaccination Programme

As the schools were closed in March the junior infant vaccination programme was put on hold. The HSE have now contacted us and following advice from the National Immunisation Office, they are currently planning to recommence the programme in the next few weeks by inviting the unvaccinated cohort of children to their local Health Centres for vaccination, to receive their booster dose of Diphtheria, Pertussis, Polio and Tetanus (4 in 1) and a second dose of Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR) vaccine. The HSE will be contacting Junior Infant families directly with appointments to attend the vaccination clinic.

This week the focus is on travel and travel methods.

The teachers will show how to measure length and area in Mathematics and Caitriona will build a small sailing boat after examining things that sink or swim in the science lesson.

In history, we will look at how travel methods have changed and how some have remained the same. Fiachra will help us stay safe on the roads in the SPHE lesson and it is the craft of Origami for the Art class.




